

# Plesiosaurs

The fossilised remains of plesiosaurs, the so-called “sea-monsters” once claimed to be inhabitants of Scotland’s Loch Ness, have been found throughout the world in marine sediments. Here, along the Bass Coast, however, plesiosaur remains have been discovered in rocks laid down in fresh water. The Victorian plesiosaurs would have likely fed on the fish and turtles living in the rivers like today’s freshwater dolphins of the Ganges and Amazon rivers.

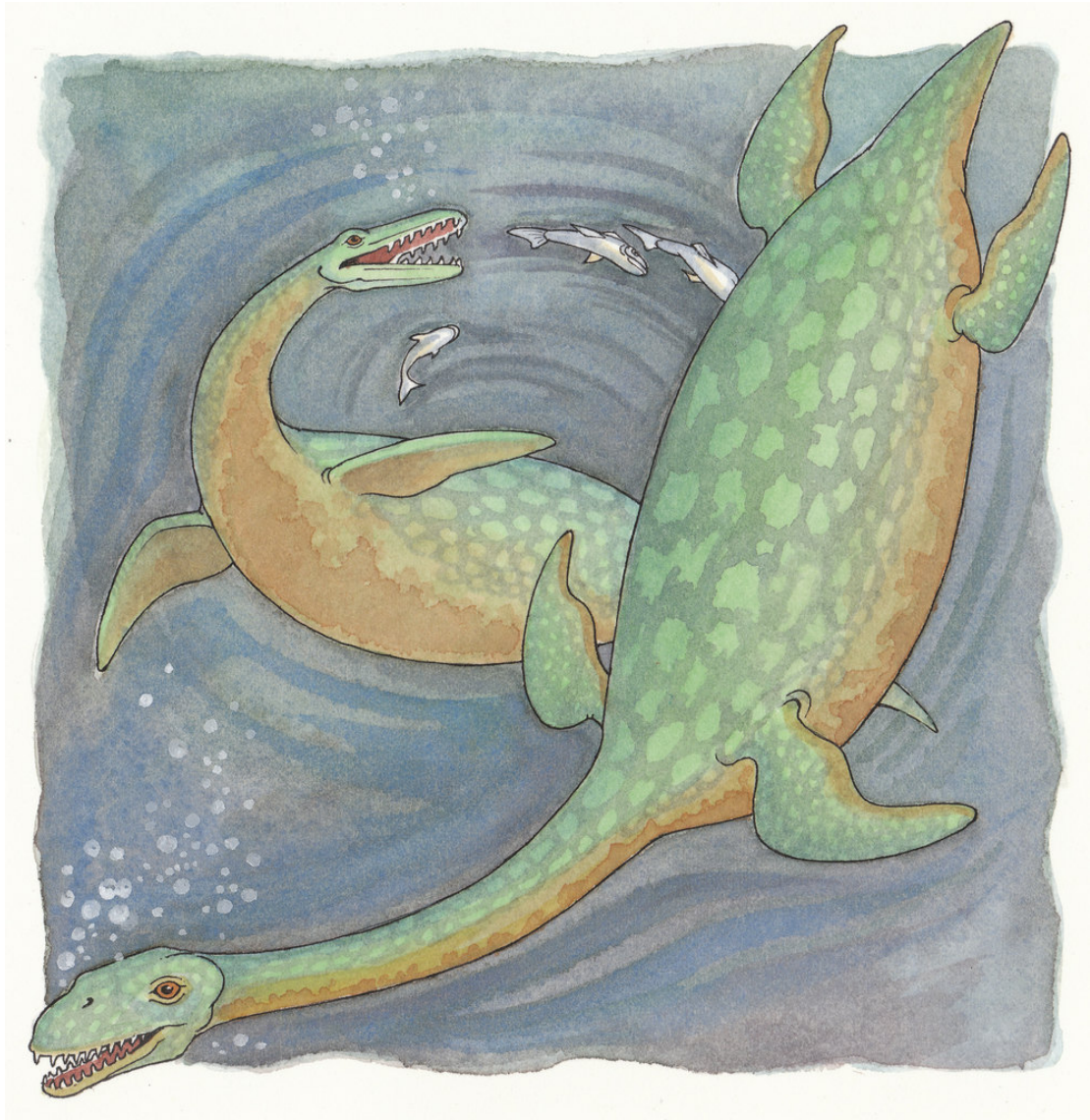


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
