

Grant applications help fund improvements......

For the 12 months leading up to last year's opening day the Board had been successful in applying for grants totalling \$17,413 to help fund many of the improvements around the club.

In the past 12 months grant applications have been lodged with success for the following;

Zip Boil hot water unit (Bass Coast Shire Community Grant) \$1,000

New tables (14) & new chairs (112) (Dept Veteran Affairs Grant) \$6,800

Water drinking fountain (Bass Coast Shire Community Grant) \$ 645

Aluminium seating (3) (Bass Coast Community Grant) \$1,000

Bowls pushers – for both greens (Bass Coast Community Grant) \$1,000

Part Funding new synthetic green (Sport & Recreation Victoria) \$50,000

Part Funding new synthetic green (Bendigo Bank – major sponsorship) \$25,000

\$85,445

In just under two years the total grants/funding has reached over \$100,000, money that has not come out of club funds and has helped to provide the many improvements and upgrades within

An expression of interest has been lodged with Federal Member for McMillan, Russell Broadbent with a view to applying for a "Stronger Communities Programme"

grant. If we are selected as being eligible, an application for funding will be lodged to provide some new shelters.

Your Board of Directors have taken a positive stance in applying where possible for any grant money which may be available from Local, State or Federal Government.
